Edna Jean Millard was born June 8, 1959 as Edna Jean Rawson, an only child to Bettie and William Henry Rawson, Jr. Her parents were both pharmacists who owned and operated an independent pharmacy and pharmacy distribution company. She lived in San Antonio, Texas most of her childhood and graduated from St. Gerards High School in 1977. She graduated from the University of Texas at Austin in 1982 with a Bachelor's of Science in Pharmacy. She remained in Texas with her husband, Tyrone, and two daughters, Alisa and Andrea.

As a retail pharmacist Edna served the greater Fort Worth area including Fort Worth, Arlington, North Richland Hills, Benbrook and Hudson Oaks. For every ailment, she was the first one in the family to be inundated with questions. When a family member or friend asked for medical advice, she often quipped "will I get paid for this?" Edna was known for her dry sense of humor and wit. She had the ability to disarm a group with laughter once they realized she was joking. She was a bookworm and a history buff, particularly with English history.

Throughout the 2000s she was a diligent supporter of her daughters' band and theater extracurriculars. She was also a Girl Scout troop leader in her daughters' girl scout troops. She enjoyed baking and had a trademark red velvet cake with buttercream frosting she would make for birthdays. Every Christmas, with the help of her daughters, she would fill tins with cookies for family and friends. She called her kitchen the "Millard Cafe," for every friend of her daughters would be greeted with snacks and meals.

In 2013, Edna quit the corporate pharmaceutical world for a chance to do something that relied less on patient quotas and a bottom line. At age 55, she enrolled in the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences and graduated in 2016 with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree. While attending school she worked as a clinical pharmacist at Lake Granbury Medical Center until retiring in January of 2019.

In August of 2021, Edna was diagnosed with stage four pancreatic cancer. She went through chemotherapy and a pancreatic enzyme treatment, respectively, until she had a pulmonary embolism in April 2022. After the embolism she faced a gradual decline and sought hospice care. Her family took care of her wellbeing until she passed away at home on June 12, 2022.

The fridge at the back of her house was full of magnets, little mementos for each place she traveled which included New Orleans, San Francisco, Mesa Verde, and Ireland. She leapt at any opportunity to plan a trip. She is on a different trip now, one full of mystery. As J.M. Baire's Peter Pan says "To die [is] an awfully big adventure." Her family believes she will have the other side mapped out by the time they get there. Her light will not be forgotten.
