
John 14:1-7

C hear our prayer.



GREAT THANKSGIVING




P It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER




- P Remember us in your kingdom, O Lord, and teach us to pray.

Krystal M. (née Kennedy) Truckenbrod, 76, passed away on September 5, 2023 in Fort Worth, Texas. Krystal was born on December 3, 1946 in Pittsburgh, PA and graduated from Apollo High School in 1964. She completed Cosmetology school in Pittsburgh before moving to Philadelphia where she worked as a cosmetologist in high-end department stores and created artistic hairstyles for fashion shows.

She lived in Laurel, Maryland for 14 years and worked for several years as an elementary school aide, sharing her artistic talents by decorating classrooms and creating art for the children. Krystal was very active at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, serving as their choir director, youth group co-leader, and High School Sunday School teacher. She was a member of altar guild, WELCA, the wedding and funeral committee, and served on church council several times over the years.

As a Navy spouse, she enjoyed traveling the world and exploring new places, always finding unique gifts for family and friends. With each move, she quickly became active in her new church home – continuing to share her beautiful voice as a soloist, directing the choir, teaching Sunday School, and serving on altar guild. She created a warm and cozy home for her family, and her table was always open to friends and military personnel longing for a home-cooked meal.

Krystal is survived by her husband Dennis, and her children and grandchildren: Dan (daughter Hannah), and Melanie (Eric, children Ben and Emma). She was preceded in death by her parents Lawrence and Vivian Kennedy, and her sister Kathy Kennedy.
