

The Liturgy at Calvary



Matthew (or Levi) was a tax collector in Capernaum for the Roman government. Tax collectors were agents of the oppressive empire, and they also had a reputation for extorting more than they had to collect. Jesus' calling Matthew to follow him showed that Jesus not only associated with "bad guys," he welcomed them into his inner circle. His sharing a meal with Matthew and other tax collectors and "sinners" was an enacted parable of the mercy of God. The meal we share at Jesus' table is to be such a parable too.

Almighty God strengthen you with power through the Holy Spirit, that Christ may live in your hearts through faith.





First Reading: Ezekiel 2:8-3:11

⁸ "You, mortal, hear what I say to you; do not be rebellious like that rebellious house; open your mouth and eat what I give you." ⁹ I looked, and a hand was stretched out to me, and a written scroll was in it. ¹⁰ He spread it before me; it had writing on the front and on the back, and written on it were words of lamentation and mourning and woe.


3:1 He said to me, "O mortal, eat what is offered to you; eat this scroll, and go, speak to the house of Israel." ²So I opened my mouth, and he gave me the scroll to eat. ³He said to me, "Mortal, eat this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it, and in my mouth it was as sweet as honey.

⁴ He said to me, "Mortal, go to the house of Israel and speak my very words to them. ⁵ For you are not sent to a people of obscure speech and difficult language but to the house of Israel, ⁶ not to many peoples of obscure speech and difficult language whose words you cannot understand. Surely, if I sent you to them, they would listen to you. ⁷ But the house of Israel will not be willing to listen to you, for they are not willing to listen to me, because all the house of Israel have a hard forehead and a stubborn heart.

⁸ See, I have made your face hard against their faces and your forehead hard against their foreheads. ⁹ Like the hardest stone, harder than flint, I have made your forehead; do not fear them or be dismayed at their looks, for they are a rebellious house." ¹⁰ He said to me, "Mortal, all my words that I shall speak to you receive in your heart and hear with your ears; ¹¹ then go to the exiles, to your people, and speak to them. Say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God,' whether they hear or refuse to hear."

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10




P It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ;




In-Person: We commune at the Altar. Ushers will guide.




