Sunday, December 14, 2025**

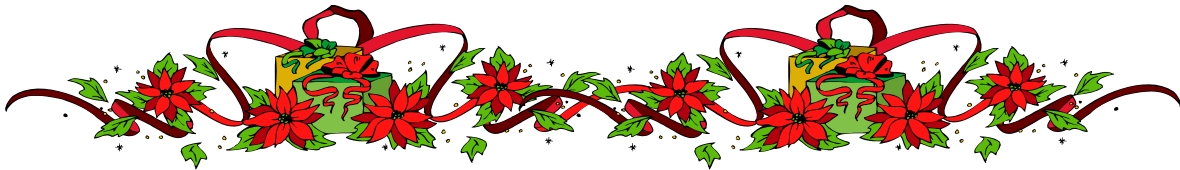
John was a member of the Carmelite monastic order and worked to reform it. His writings reflect a deep interest in mystical thought and meditation.
