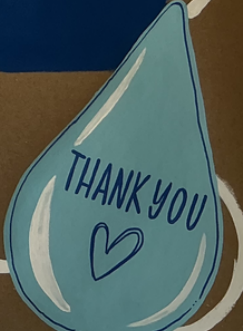

Calvary Lutheran Church - Mission Trip 2026

Mission Trip 2026

For one week this summer, our youth and adult leaders stepped away from the constant buzz of phones, busy schedules and everyday routines to focus on something bigger than themselves. Mission trips have a way of reminding us that joy is often found not in comfort or convenience, but in serving others, building relationships, and recognizing where God is at work. We met people passionate about serving, including our host pastor, Pastor Melissa; the Habitat families; the staff at Children & Family Advocacy Center (CFAC); Shannon with Feast of Grace; and the many volunteers who work at the food pantries.

This year's trip also came with a few unexpected challenges. A construction project changed just a week before our departure, which shifted housing and shower arrangements. After those were resolved, plumbing issues arose at our host site, and limited refrigerator space meant making daily grocery runs. Yet, through every challenge, our team adapted with flexibility, patience, and grace. Those obstacles did not define the week. Instead, they became opportunities to trust God, work together, and discover that the best mission trips aren't the ones where everything goes according to plan—they're the ones where God's faithfulness shines through every unexpected turn. We are grateful to share a glimpse of where we saw God at work.

Our Mission Trip was to Northwest Arkansas, where we partnered with Peace Lutheran Food Pantry, Christ the King Food Pantry, Feast of Grace Meal, Habitat for Humanity, and the Children & Family Advocacy Center.

- Preparing a freezer full of meals for single moms living in The Lodge, which is a safe, communal living environment where they can rebuild their lives.
- Working with the Peace Lutheran Church food pantry, restocking shelves and bringing boxes of food to the cars of families experiencing food insecurity.
- Preparing and packaging meals with Feast of Grace feeding ministry so that when families picked up food from the Christ the King Food Pantry, they also took home a hot meal.
- Working with the Christ the King Lutheran Church food pantry, restocking shelves and bringing boxes of food to the cars of families experiencing food insecurity.
- Working on three separate Habitat for Humanity houses at different stages of completion. On several days, the building team got to meet and work alongside the homeowners.
- Restoring (through demolition, repairs, replacement and refresh projects) the House of Faith, a transitional living home for single mom families, recovering from trauma and working to gain independence.
- Bible verses and words of blessing were added by all the teams to the Habitat homes (on studs and beneath siding) and the House of Faith (beneath the new bedroom floors).

Reading Acts 2:42-47, I realized that what we experienced this week wasn't something new. It was the Church living the way God intended. Whether we were serving meals, painting walls, praying with people, or simply spending time together, we were living out that same picture of a community centered on Christ and caring for one another. – Brooklynn

I couldn't even imagine how much patience and care it takes God to walk with us in our struggles. So, for God being our refuge and our sense of peace, let us give thanks to him always in every circumstance, because he never fails us and never gives up on us. – Travis

Throughout our service projects, we found ways to bring smiles and hope wherever we went. – Jack

This year was even more special because each song brought back a memory of a different mission trip or just a great youth group moment. – Tucker

It made me realize that our mission didn't begin when we arrived in Arkansas, and it didn't end when we left. It started with a church praying over us, continued through serving others, and now it continues as we go back home to love and serve the people in our own communities. – Brooklynn

I call Calvary my home; in a way, it is a refuge for me. A place where I find peace and feel loved. – Travis

A call to the congregation to not let our faith stay within these walls, but to go out into the community and meet their needs there. – Jack (and Spencer)

Always remember that your actions, big or small, can make a huge difference in someone's life and in this world. – Tucker

Never underestimate the impact of community. You never know how God can use a simple meal, a fresh coat of paint, a prayer, or even a welcoming church family to change someone's life. I know He used all of those things to change mine. – Brooklynn

Calvary is my place, where I am filled with so much hope and peace that I can overflow with joy into all that I do. – Travis

The place I saw God the most was in the people around me. The youth group isn't just a bunch of high schoolers but rather a culture based on building each other up. – Jack

Momma said it is a big deal to travel and serve people, but she also reminded me that you do not have to go on a trip to be God's hands and feet. Lots of ministry was happening here at Calvary too. There are ministries that quietly happen (I hear mission trips are not quiet) every week or month to make sure our church is taken care of and that our neighbors are too....

The WELCA girls made Christmas stockings. I thought the heat was getting to them and they were dreaming of winter, but it turns out that you have to plan ahead to be ready for Christmas. Now they are sorting through truckloads of donated materials to see what they can use and what they can gift to other people.

The ladies with sticks and yarn keep meeting and making goodies for people in between all their laughing! The mowers keep racing each other on lawnmowers and calling it work-- they are so much fun to help! The Room in the Inn team is up here every week making sure a few people get to cool down for at least a little while in this heat. Mary is dreaming of nature and painting by the water fountain and I am not allowed to touch shiny paint because it gets on my paws.

People are still helping sort and pass out food at NEED and there are people who make lunch each month for a Senior Center. That is a place for grandparents, and lots of them do not like little furry critters as much as the kids, so once again I stayed home. It is a good thing that home at Calvary is a good place to be! Stay cool, friends!
