Stewardship Corner

During the first part of the 2026 liturgical year, Calvary's Stewardship Committee has been prayerfully working to build a meaningful foundation for stewardship within our congregation. As a newly formed committee, one of our first major milestones was the creation of the Ministry Index. This resource was designed to help connect Calvary members with the many ways they can share their gifts, talents, and passions in service to God and one another.

Alongside the Ministry Index, the committee introduced the "Seasons of Stewardship" initiative, centered on the offertory prayer we share each Sunday:

"Merciful Father, we offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us - our selves, our time, and our possessions, signs of your gracious love..."

Through temple talks, Caller articles, emails and conversations, we began exploring what it means to be good stewards of these gifts God has first entrusted to us. Rather than focusing only on financial giving, these seasons encouraged us to reflect more deeply on stewardship as a daily expression of faith and gratitude.

The foundation of this journey began with "our selves", caring for ourselves spiritually, emotionally and physically allows us to serve others more faithfully and fully. As Val Wilkerson shared during her temple talk, stewardship includes "appreciating, respecting and caring for what God has first given us." She reminded us that we cannot continually "pour from an empty cup," encouraging each of us to consider how we care for our spiritual, emotional and physical well-being so we can better serve others.

From there, we explored the stewardship of "our time", recognizing that simply showing up, serving, listening, helping and being present are valuable gifts. Jonathan Berry reflected on how stewardship changes through different seasons of life and reminded us that sometimes "just showing up is what's needed." He shared the powerful story of a handmade scarf that became priceless not because of its cost, but because someone gave six months of their time to create it.

Finally, we reflected on "our possessions", both tangible and intangible, including our resources, talents, skills and acts of generosity that bless our church and community every day. Cat Andejaski reminded us that stewardship often happens in ways we may not even recognize. Through generosity, kindness, service and sharing our God-given talents. She highlighted the many ways Calvary already lives this out: stuffing Christmas stockings for children, filling food boxes, donating supplies to those in need, singing in the choir, teaching classes, serving meals, washing dishes and quietly helping wherever help is needed.

As we look ahead, your Stewardship Committee views these efforts not as an ending, but as an important milestone in continuing to grow a culture of joyful stewardship at Calvary. We invite every member of our congregation to continue reflecting on how God is calling each of us to be good stewards of our selves, our time, and our possessions as we live out our faith together.

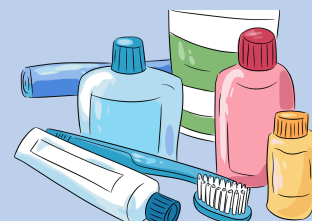

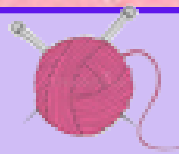
