



hen natural disasters strike or war drives families from their homes, our hearts ache with compassion, but often we don't know how to help. Making Lutheran World Relief Kits is a simple, fun and tangible way to offer comfort to those suffering and express love to our neighbors in need.

Kits are specifically designed to help people coping with poverty, disaster, conflict and more. In the direst of situations, these extensions of your congregation's love bring dignity and hope.



Congregations play a critical role in helping ensure we have enough kits for the constant demand we receive. Personal Care Kits, which provide muchneeded self-care and critical germ-fighting tools, are one of our most requested items. **Moses Kabogo, LWR staff in Tanzania**, spoke about how Personal Care Kits are used.

and their incredible impact for our most vulnerable neighbors. He has witnessed firsthand the impact of Personal Care Kits on pregnant and new mothers.

WHO RECEIVES PERSONAL CARE KITS IN TANZANIA?

We distribute Personal Care Kits to health facilities in Tanzania, focusing on pregnant and those new mothers who have just delivered.

HOW ARE THESE KITS USED?

Most pregnant and new mothers, especially in the rural areas, do not have access to personal care items. The kits distributed through LWR in health facilities provide these mothers with items such as towels, soap and nail clippers. The items help them clean and cover themselves and their babies, protecting them from the cold. In addition to keeping themselves and their babies clean, they also love the soaps because they smell so good!

WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF A PERSONAL CARE KIT?

It is a huge challenge to get pregnant mothers to give birth at health facilities. It is often far from their homes, and they worry about the expenses of medical care. We found that distributing Personal Care Kits is a great incentive for women to come to the health facilities. This way we can make sure the mothers and newborns receive the proper care plus they have supplies to help them when they get back home.

We are grateful to Calvary's WELCA ministry who has faithfully made these Personal Care Kits for many years, made possible through their volunteers hours and your donations.

I heard one say that it is always good to bring a little bit of home wherever you go! I have been waiting to be big enough for a long time and I am excited to tell you about a youth gathering. Kids from a bunch of churches met at one big church in Dallas. We got to play games with one of the pastors from camp, sing songs, listen to a lady talk to us about how to be a change in the world and eat. Sooo... when there are more than a 100 kids and they are all talking excitedly there is a lot of food on the tables and floor. I think Janelle was grateful that me and the other friends I met stayed after to help clean like some of the Calvary big kids did. I heard her say she was so proud of us! On Saturday afternoon we got to rotate through workshops with different grown ups and it was really fun to learn different things. Saturday night we had a dance! I was a hot sweaty mess on the dance floor and while I wanted to show off my moves, all I really got to do was dodge the big kids feet — they were a hot mess on the dance for too! All of that music and laughing was a great end to the day.

Oh yea, on the special football day Brayden, Beckett and Holden coached the congregation to TACKLE HUNGER. They had a contest to see if the Chiefs box or 49'ers box would fill first and it was the 49er's! Calvary people filled the NEED cart to overflowing and donated money so even more food could be bought for people with rumbly tummies. It is pretty cool that kids my age got to lead this project!
