COUNCIL CORNER

With Joy and Thanksgiving

It is my pleasure to report on the year-to-date results through August 31, 2025. Our congregation continues to be blessed by the faith and dedication of Calvary and its members!

As of August 31, year-to-date income is \$13k under budget and expenses are \$14k under budget for a \$1k net savings vs budget. The income underage is primarily due to the timing of large donations, which are recognized over time vs. immediately. The expense underage is due largely to staffing and insurance. Since January 1 the open Accounting Manager position has been staffed by volunteers resulting in a savings of \$9k as of August 31.

Property insurance also contributed to actual 2025 expenses being less than budgeted. Calvary's 2025 property insurance cost increased nearly 100% over the prior year (\$45,600 2025 budget vs. \$22,800 actual) due to a change in providers. The increased expense was included in the 2025 budget approved by the congregation. The Finance Committee vowed to continue searching for a better solution.

In February, the Finance Committee checked into Insurance Board, a provider of property and liability insurance for churches. Despite the very lengthy and cumbersome application process, the Finance Committee believed good stewardship meant checking it out. And it paid off! In April, 2025, improved comprehensive property and general liability policies were secured for \$28k annually, a savings of nearly \$16k. As of August 31, \$5k in savings has been recognized. Special thanks to Don Acker, Debra Machos, Linda McMillan and Rick Miller who worked diligently on this exhaustive effort.

I am especially grateful for the dedication of the Finance Committee members who faithfully serve Calvary. The committee is currently looking for new members. Please reach out to Pastors Kyle, a Finance Committee member, Council member or the office if interested. You will be welcomed!

The AudioVisual Team Needs YOU!

What's involved in serving on the Team?

- Arrive early to perform equipment checks before the worship service and to prepare for worship
- During the worship service, manage microphone selection and volume/mute control. Videography performs camera selection, pre-stages next camera shot, effectively zooms the camera for effect and maintains the live feed.
- Following each worship service, account for mobile devices and ensures they are recharged for the next service. Following the 11:00am service, perform shutdown procedures.

What is it like to run Audio Visual for a worship service?

- Concentrating on the sequence and flow of the worship service means we pay very close attention to the many aspects of the worship experience
- There is quite a bit of action in the relatively small sound booth. We work well as a team and help each other out.
- Being flexible and willing to learn are key characteristics we share. Also being comfortable with technology and being able to trouble shoot and pivot on the fly

Is prior experience required or is there training for new volunteers?

- Prior experience is welcome but not required. Please feel free to observe in the booth and learn more about this ministry
- Gary Graeber or Zach Williams will provide hands-on training for new volunteers
- New volunteers will shadow the team until they are comfortable.


